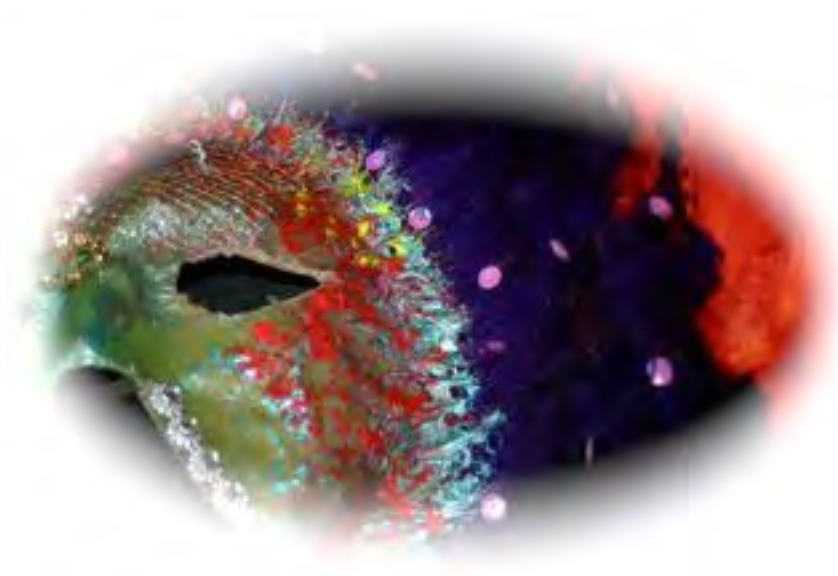


# DISCOVERING THE UNLIVED LIFE THROUGH DREAM AND MASK WORK

**This event** is for people who have experienced at least two years personal development work, who wish to deepen their self understanding and learn about the processes of active imagination and working with dreams.

*N.B. If any therapists attending this event find that clients of theirs are also attending the event, the programme will be structured so that teaching is provided in a large group and dream circles, mask-making and deeper personal work will be run in separate groups with private space.*

**The intention** of the event is to provide a personal reflection retreat, building on dream circles, mask-making, bodywork, voice and art. There will be some teaching on the dream process. Held in the lovely setting of Hegnegarden, on the island of Orø, situated in the fjords of Denmark, we will use the inner and outer space of nature's environment to share dreams, to connect with the unlived life, and develop personal masks as a symbol of new life. Each individual mask is made on the face reflecting authentic characteristics of the self, as well as a deeper archetypal form.

**We will honour** the discipline of morning silence, a time for self reflection, journaling dreams and meditation. Then working with individual dreams in dream circles we will follow the energy of the dream in the body, working with symbols and images in an embodied form. The energy and art forms that emerge are represented in the mask-making process, which then becomes embodied through wearing the mask.

**We will draw** on a combination of Gestalt concepts and Jung's Map of the Psyche through the teachings of Marion Woodman. Marion Woodman is a Jungian analyst who developed a way of working with the human psyche through the body, voice, art and dreams, with her colleagues Mary Hamilton, a dance and movement teacher, and Ann Skinner who teaches voice and theatre.

She has a Diploma in Organisational Consulting (Gestalt), teaches Gestalt as organisational practice in the UK and abroad, is a visiting contributor to GIS and a lead consultant for the Gestalt in Organisations programme with the Gestalt Foundation, Greece. Sue has published a number of books, with a recently co-edited book on 'Education and Imagination' released in 2008. She is currently researching a PhD on corporate leadership and leadership development. As part of her research she is studying the contribution that arts-informed learning can offer in leadership learning.

**Marian Dunlea, MSc**, is a Jungian Analyst working in private practice in Dublin, Ireland. Her training and experience encompasses Psychoanalysis, Psychosynthesis, Authentic Movement, Trauma training, voice work, and theatre. She has taught in psychotherapy training institutes and in university programs, and she facilitates workshops nationally and internationally. She is a core faculty member and teaches regularly for the Marion Woodman Foundation, where her particular focus is working with dreams in an embodied form.

**Maja Reinau, M.D.** A Zurich trained Jungian analyst in private practice, Maja also works as a psychiatrist for children and adolescents at the University Hospital of Aarhus, Denmark. Maja has facilitated workshops and given lectures internationally. Her special research interests are currently centred around the exciting interrelationship between the Jungian approach, recent developmental theories and the new findings in neuroscience. She is eager to explore interrelationships that help us to appreciate, embrace and encourage the multiplicity and diversity of the soul.
